YOUR OPTIONS



Semester abroad

NBS students can study abroad for one or two semesters during their studies. To do so, they choose a partner university or go to any university worldwide as a freemover.



Internship abroad

NBS students can complete an internship abroad. This is particularly suitable for Bachelor's full-time programs that include a fixed internship semester.



Further possibilities

Other opportunities include participation in language courses or summer schools abroad. This variant is less time-consuming and therefore also less expensive.



Buddy program

In order to make the acclimatization process as pleasant as possible for the foreign students, the Buddy Program was established: NBS students help the foreign guest students to find their way in Hamburg and at our campus. The buddies' tasks include participating in a Welcome Day (as well as organizing the social program) and being available to the incoming students.

Funding options

There are a variety of funding opportunities to support the stay abroad of students or employees of the NBS students or employees of the NBS. These include:

- Erasmus (EU program designed, among other things, to facilitate foreign exchange in the European educational area).
- PROMOS (funding from the German Academic Exchange Service, DAAD)
- Other scholarships (exclusive NBS scholarships at selected partner universities, DAAD scholarship database, travel grants for active participation in conferences, etc.)
